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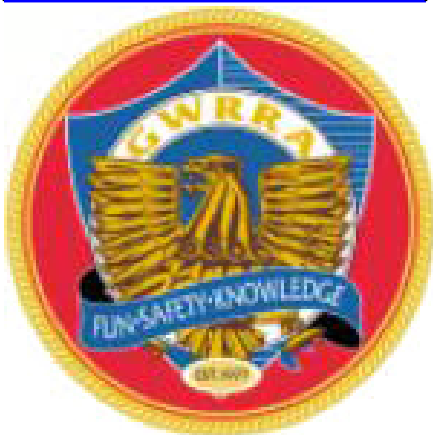

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## WHAT'S COOKIN'

### Pancetta-Wrapped Pork Roast

#### Ingredients

- 8 large garlic cloves
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh rosemary leaves
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh thyme leaves
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 (3 1/2 to 4-pound) tied boneless pork loin roast
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 4 ounces thinly sliced pancetta
- 1 1/2 cups chicken broth
- 1 1/2 cups dry white wine

#### Directions

Blend the garlic, rosemary, thyme, and oil in a small food processor, scraping down the sides of the bowl occasionally, until the garlic is minced.

Sprinkle the pork roast generously with salt and pepper. Arrange the pancetta slices on a work surface, overlapping slightly and forming a rectangle. Spread half of the garlic mixture over 1 side of the pork and between the 2 loins that meet in the center of the tied pork roast. Place the pork, garlic mixture side down, in the center of the pancetta rectangle. Spread the remaining garlic mixture over the remaining pork. Wrap the pancetta slices around the pork. Place the pork in a roasting pan. Cover and refrigerate at least 1 hour and up to 1 day.

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.

Pour 1/2 cup of broth and 1/2 cup of wine into the roasting pan. Add more broth and wine to the pan juices every 20 minutes. Roast the pork until a meat thermometer inserted into the center registers 145 degrees F for medium-rare, about 1 hour. Transfer the pork to a cutting board. Tent with aluminum foil and let stand for 10 minutes. Pour the pan drippings into a glass measuring cup and spoon off any fat that rises to the top.

Using a large sharp carving knife, cut the pork into 1/4-inch-thick slices and serve with the pan juices.

## Rider Education

### Riding Heavy Bikes Off-Road

Adventure bikes are primarily street-going (80 percent) dual-sport bikes with engines over 650 cc and weights over 500 pounds. With one of these big bikes you can add more than 100 pounds of cargo and hit the highway for hundreds of miles at 80 mph in relative comfort, then turn down a dirt road or trail to get to a remote fishing lake, if you have the skills and confidence to ride it in the dirt.

Many adventure bike riders come from street riding and have little or no dirt training or experience, they have been through street training to get their license, but dirt is completely foreign and usually intimidates them—rightfully so on such a large, top-heavy, powerful expensive motorcycle.

In today's world of do-it-yourself TV shows and instant Google searches for quick solutions, adventure bike riders want to hit the back roads with their new bikes immediately, but lack the special skills and techniques to ride them well.

The reality is that with highly consequential motorcycle riding, good skills require training and are perishable without constant practice. So, here is a simple approach. First, learn to ride on a dirt bike with all the proper safety gear and good training. Next, take a higher-level dirt riding class where you can spin the tires, pop a wheelie, and maybe even jump a little

All motorcycles have two wheels, two brakes and basically turn, accelerate and stop the same way. It's the bike's size and terrain that varies.

On a smaller, friendlier and durable dirt bike, you will learn more and faster than on a bigger, heavier and more powerful motorcycle. That's why dirt bikes are best for developing the sound fundamentals needed to ride any motorcycle well.

Practice on your adventure bike, too, taking the time to learn about your bike's traction control, anti-lock braking and other high-performance modes.

When it comes to riding motorcycles—especially with such marvels as modern adventure bikes—the best way to learn to ride them all proficiently is still the same; In the dirt first!

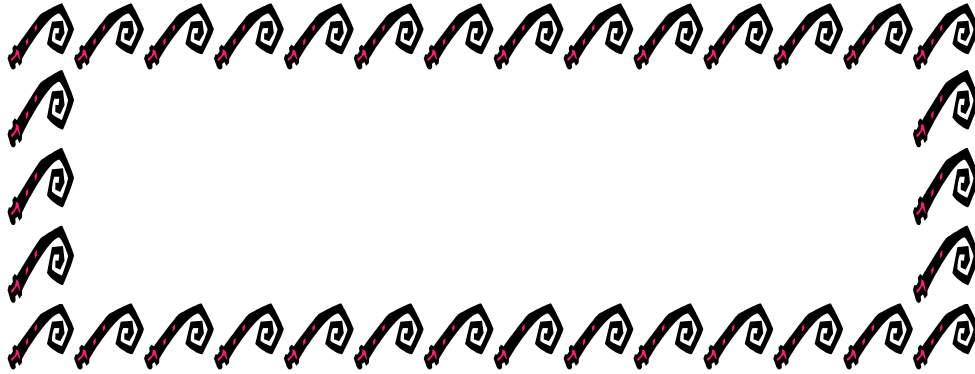
